Campaign Background

In the summer of 2014, a dirty bomb was detonated in Richmond, VA. The death toll reached over 4,000 and additional 24,000 citizens fell seriously ill. Over 25 miles were evacuated around the blast zone due to airborne radiation particles. A 2-mile radius of the detonation zone had to be sealed off permanently causing over 22,000 people to be relocated. The incident caused mass panic and economic turmoil throughout the world. An immediate rush was on to find the person, persons, or organization responsible. As a result of an exhaustive investigation, two Islamic linked Extremist Groups named Al-Doran and Special Purpose Islamic Army (SPIA) were directly linked to the attack. The U.S. swore to bring the individuals responsible to justice, and to eradicate Al-Doran at all costs. The U.S. and her Allies began an intense campaign to go after Al-Doran and any terrorist organizations associated with the group around the world. This campaign became known as “**Operation Piercing Fury.**” The build-up and deployment of Coalition Forces in response to the attack trumped the size and speed of Operation Iraqi Freedom by two-fold. The U.S. reinitiated the Draft, and the War was on. The pressure and devastation on Al-Doran and other extremist groups in the Middle East was so intense that many moved their operations to the Country of Georgia with the financial backing of the Islamic International Peacekeeping Regiment (IIPR). The SPIA and Sabotage Battalion of Islamic Martyrs welcomed the groups with open arms. Their goal is to unite together and turn the world, beginning with Europe into an Islamic Empire.

Current Situation

Rebel and terrorist forces have occupied key cities within the Country of Georgia. Al-Doran, SPIA, and other key terrorist organizations have flocked to the region to regroup, retrain, and strategize to take over Europe and spread their Islamic ideals to the world. A small United Nations peacekeeping force was ordered into the country under Resolution 435.1 to establish a Secure Zone and No-Fly Zone in the southern and central region of Georgia. The UN forces under strict rules of engagement were quickly overtaken by the rebel and terrorist forces in the region, and were forced to retreat. Coalition Forces led by the United States are tasked in bringing order back to the region, eliminate the terrorist nexus, and Capture or Kill High Value Targets / War Criminals who have engulfed the region. Enemy resistance has been very strong, and Intelligence Reports suggest many of the rebel and terrorist groups are receiving financial and supply assistance from Iran, Syria, IIPR, and possibly senior members of other Middle Eastern countries.

- Eliminate the terrorist nexus inside of Georgia
- “Capture-or-Kill” High Value Targets and / or War Criminals in the Region
- Maintain Air Superiority in the Region



Chain of Command / Friendly Forces in the AOR

A Squadron of F-15E's from the 48st Fighter Wing (based out of RAF Lakenheath AB, UK) Have been forward deployed to Georgia to support OPF. The overall Chain of Command for OPF consists of a Multi-Nation Coalition Based structure similar to NATO. However, due to The emphasis on Special Forces and "Other-Government-Type" (OGA) missions throughout The region, elements of the FW have been directly tasked to support Joint Special Forces Command (JSOC). The JSOC Commander for this Campaign is US Army Colonel John Stevens.

Chain of Command / Friendly Forces in the AOR

Various friendly forces are currently operating in the Area of Responsibility (AOR). Many unconventional forces are also operating in the AOR striking insurgent forces 24/7. The 51st FW will be supporting all Coalition Forces in the AOR to ensure Campaign Objectives are completed.



Area of Responsibility (AOR)

The current staging area and Area of Responsibility (AOR) for the 48th FW is the region encompassing Kutaisi Air Base (AB). Friendly Forces have been forward deployed to Senaki AB, Forward Operation Base (FOB) Suse, and Combat Outposts (COP) Moto and Eagles Nest. The AOR may expand throughout OPF based on enemy movement, intelligence, and strategic information.



Forward Operating Base (FOB) Suse

Forward Operating Base (FOB) Suse is Headquarters for OPF. Friendly forces frequently stage operations from FOB Suse. FOB Suse includes a Theater Internment Facility (TIF) known as TIF Cropper housing approximately 2,500 Enemy Prisoners of War (EPW) also referred to as detainees. FOB Suse has three fully operational Forward Aerial Refueling Points (FARPS) to support Conventional and Non-Conventional Forces in the AOR. FOB Suse is a High Priority Asset in the region and been the target of frequent direct and indirect enemy attacks have since its opening in Spring 2015.

Combat Outpost (COP) Moto

Combat Outpost (COP) Moto provides over watch, indirect fire support, and facilitates direct action raids to tribal regions in the North and East sectors of the AOR. COP Moto has one operational FARP and limited supplies. Elements of the US Army 3rd Infantry Division and 43rd Military Police Brigade are stationed at COP Moto. COP Moto has a Listening / Observation Post (LP/OP) callsign Lima-7 located 2.8 KM's NE of COP Moto for early warning and intelligence gathering capabilities.



Combat Outpost (COP) Eagles Nest

Combat Outpost (COP) Eagles Nest provides intelligence, surveillance, reconnaissance (ISR) capabilities, over watch, indirect fire support, and facilitates direct action raids to tribal regions in the South and West sectors of the AOR. COP Eagles Nest has one operational FARP and limited supplies. Elements of the US Army 3rd Infantry Division and 10th Mountain Division are stationed at COP Moto.

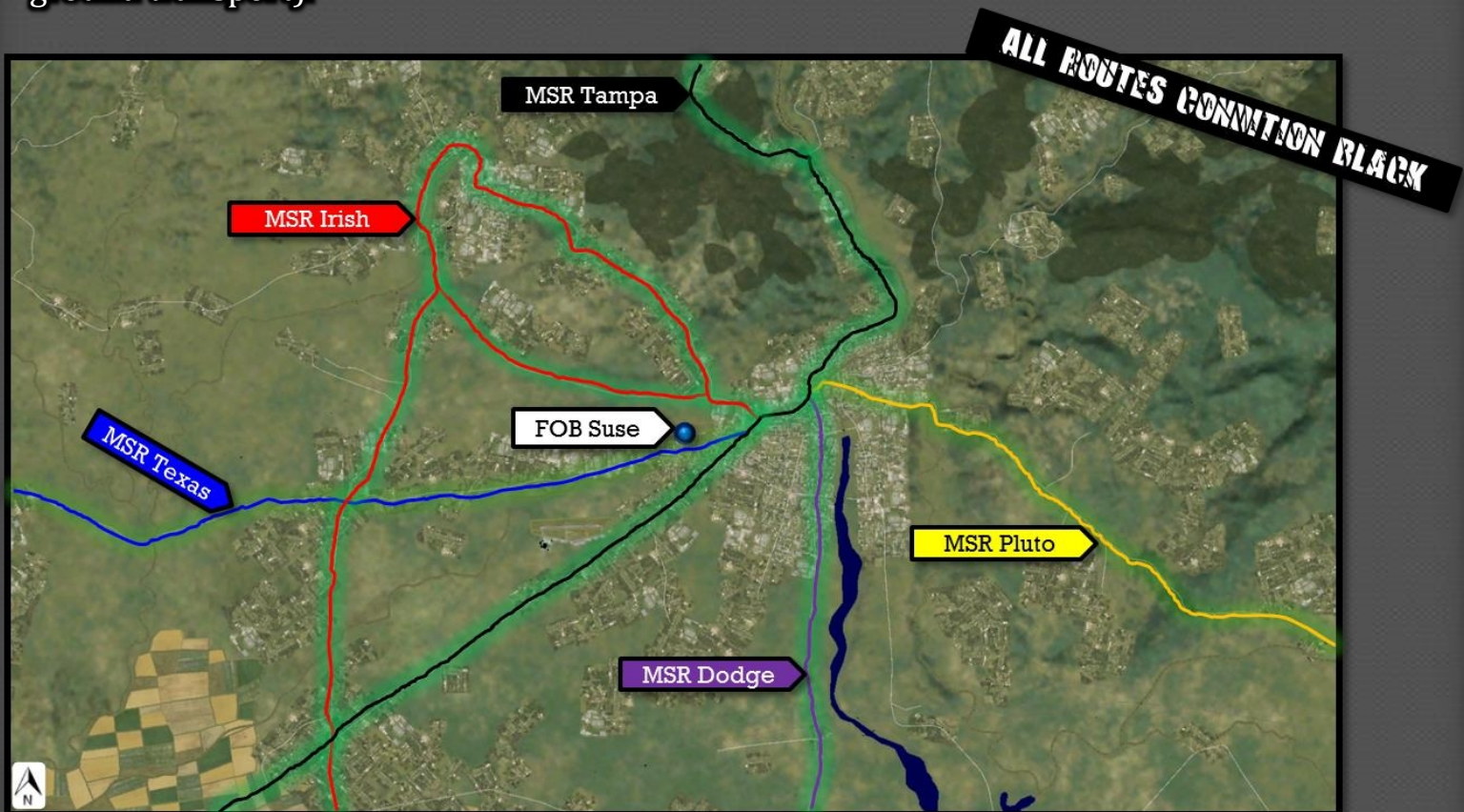

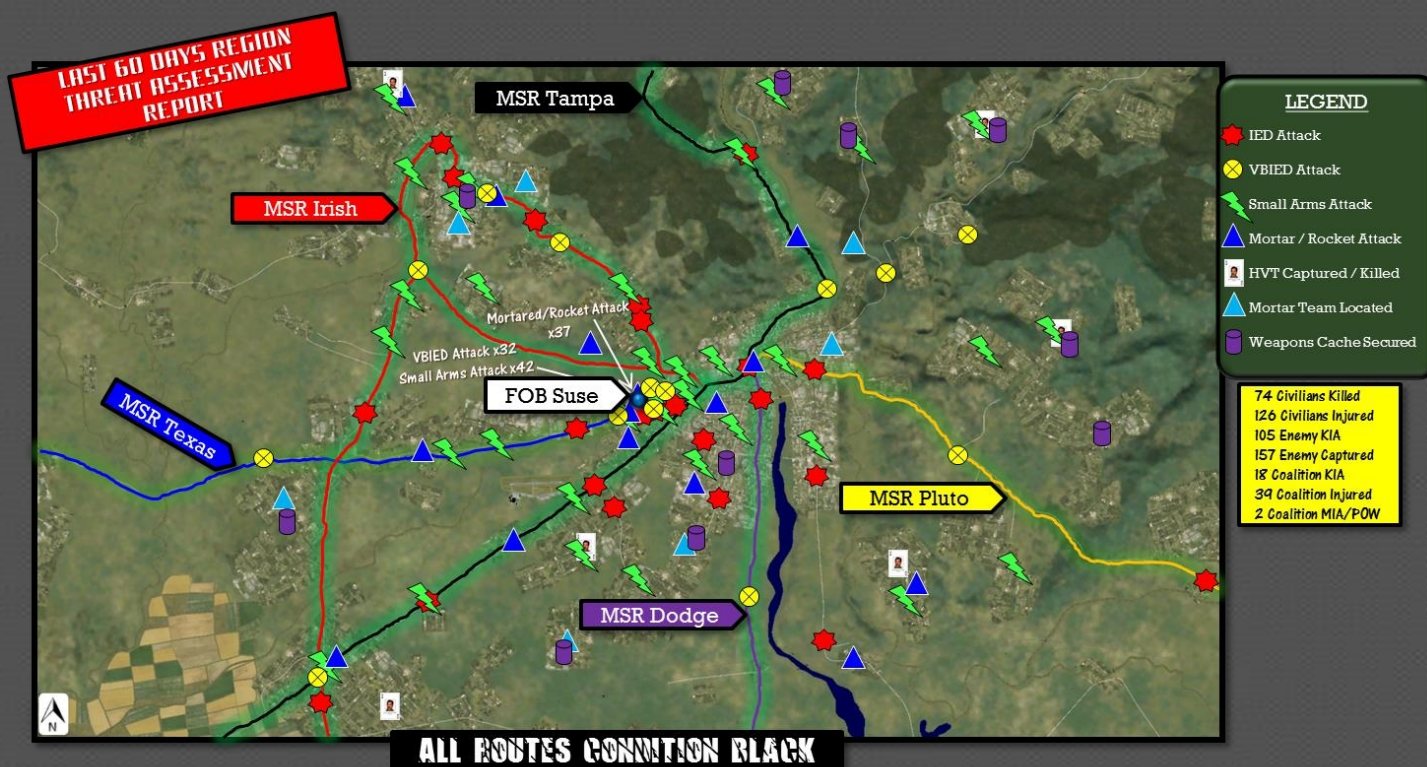
Major Supply Routes in the AOR

Major Supply Routes (MSR) provide logistic and ground transport for Coalition Forces in the AOR. Due to the number of attacks on the MSR's the road conditions are **CONDITION BLACK**. **Condition Green** indicates route is clear, no to low risk of danger, **Condition Yellow** indicates medium risk of danger, **Condition Red** indicates high risk of danger, Condition Black indicates extreme risk of danger, routes closed (requires special authorization for ground transport).



Region Threat Assessment Report

Regional Threat Assessment Report for the AOR. Enemy Forces have been using various direct and indirect attacks against Friendly Forces throughout the region.



SAM Footprints

Due to the various threats in the region and the persistent threat of ground-to-air missile threats at our airbases in the AO, additional security and Quick Reaction Forces (QRF) post out 5- 6 KM's from the airfield during flight operations. Coalition forces call this posting the SAM footprints, or just footprints for short. These Security Forces, Military Police, and other combat units consists of static posts, road checkpoints, entry control points, mobile patrols, and quick reaction force patrols to secure a perimeter and sweep the Kutaisi AO for enemy threats. In some situations depending on intel, helicopter patrols are tasked to assist with reconnaissance and QRF capabilities for additional support. Ensure you contact the command post before take-off and when inbound to Kutaisi to get a status of the footprints.

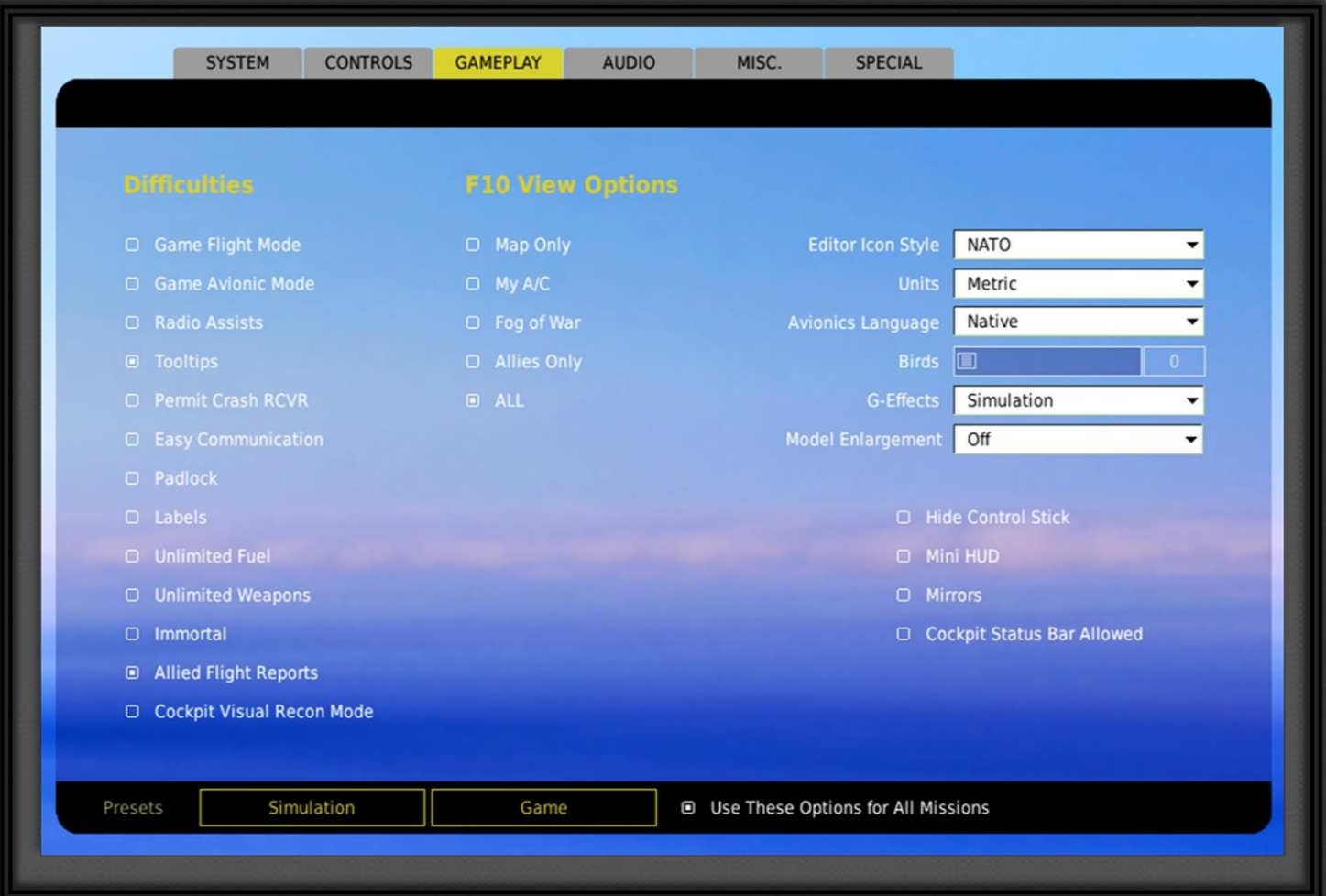
